Leadlighting

During winter, wouldn't you love to make something unique and beautiful? Something you can proudly display at home or even pass it on as a special gift?



Leadlighting cuts plain or coloured glass into shape, then joins those shapes with lead to form a picture.

Designing the image you want to produce, selecting the colours and then cutting the glass takes care and concentration. But it is also extremely satisfying as you see the image come together.

Maybe your first leadlight could be a suncatcher, a shape you can hang in front of a window to catch the light, or you can hang it on a Christmas Tree. Maybe you would prefer to start with a mirror with coloured glass features or a coloured glass jewel box. Once you have learnt how to leadlight, you can progress to larger and more complex items. How about a new window to catch the morning (or evening) sun or even the image of your dog.

The NRCHI Leadlighting course tutor is Noel Ashby.



Noel has been teaching at NRCHI for around 11 years now. Prior to that he was himself a student. Then, when his teacher decided to retire he was asked whether he would take over. He says he nervously accepted the challenge.

When asked what he most enjoys about the class he answered: "It is wonderful to see a new student learn a new skill and to create a small work of art. It is great how all the

other students offer their help too. There is a lot of sharing that takes place, whether it is a piece of glass or use of a certain tool. The camaraderie is certainly contagious."

He also added that he uses a very light-hearted approach in the class and he makes it fun and always offers assistance. As a result, long lasting friendships have grown from these classes.

What is the difference between Leadlighting and Stained Glass?

Put simply leadlighting is joining pieces of cut glass with H shape length of lead (called lead came). This glass could be clear or coloured (stained).



Stained glass refers to glass that is coloured and then refired to "stain" the glass. Also, as is common in old church stained glass, an image can be painted on the glass, then fired to make the image a permanent part of the glass.

So by convention, leadlighting and stained glass can be the same, but we often think of stained glass as being the complex large windows such as in churches.

Computers

Maroondah News

Each month the Maroondah Council produces "Maroondah News". (click on the following to take you to the link: www.news@maroondah.vic.gov.au). If you live in the City of Maroondah, it has some interesting information about what is



happening locally. For example, the current edition has an article on Maroondah's long-serving community employees who have worked for 20 and 30 years in a range of services, from school crossing supervisors, youth workers, librarians, maternal and child health nurses and customer service to parks maintenance officers, family support workers, town planners and engineers. Each has played an important role in the

Maroondah community.



There is also information on a display at Eastland "It's Not Rocket Science". This commences on Thursday 27 July and will continue to Sunday 20 August and celebrates art and science in an installation series by world renowned artists.



At Realm in Ringwood Town Square there is a unique exhibition of photographs titled "Neighbourhood Tales", an exhibition produced in Maroondah and surrounding suburbs between 2020 and 2022 by Selina Ou, in collaboration with her two sons. This is a compelling series of images that is both intensely personal and universally relatable. This runs from Saturday 15 July to Sunday 17 September.


