


cakes etc) with other members of our community as well as our terrific staff.

Donation of a large TV - thank you EERN

The community room with our library, tea and coffee making facilities, sofas, chairs and tables is a great place to relax. We are also planning to make it a place where people can enjoy some television, maybe a children's show while Mum or Dad are doing a class, a movie with friends or even a football match. NRCHI was therefore excited to be provided with a large TV from Eastern Emergency Relief Network (EERN).

EERN is a charity that picks up donated household items and passes them through over 100 welfare agencies to people in need. These include kitchen utensils crockery, sofas, table, chairs, beds, washing machines and TVs.



If you have any household items in good condition you want to get rid of (and live in the Whitehorse or one of the surrounding Council areas), why not donate them to EERN. Just contact them and tell them what you have. They may ask for a picture and if suitable, they will organise for the EERN truck to come and pick them up.

As an example of what's on in the next few weeks there is:

 a workshop on storage methods to reduce food waste (Thursday 16 Nov 6pm – 7:30pm) at the Maroondah Federation Estate

This workshop advises on getting food storage right so that it extends the life of food. This means less waste and saves money. The workshop will cover tips on using fridge and



freezers wisely, to prolong the life of food, pantry storage to minimise waste and explains the difference between "use-by" and "best before" dates. It also discusses what to do with commonly leftover ingredients. To find out more go to the Maroondah City Council site and search for "Smart Storage to Reduce Food Waste Workshop"

• The Great Southern Bioblitz (Friday, 24 November - Monday, 27 November 2023

This is a project where community members use an app on their phones (iNaturalist) to register plants and aims to provide input to prepare an image of the planet earth.

The project invites people to explore, discover and learn about the rich biodiversity in Maroondah. Participants head outside their own backyard, street, local park or creek to seek out and record the range of wild plants, animals and fungi they can find during the four days of the Bioblitz.

To participate people are asked to download the iNaturalist app.



During the Bioblitz Maroondah City Council will be running several "Nature discovery" activities. To find out more go to the Maroondah City Council site and search for Bioblitz

your dog's wagging tail. You can buy images to stick inside your window or paint one yourself. Maybe get a large photo and stick it inside. You can even use an image of a cat.




